

# **Vital Statistics from the Colonial Patriot (Pictou) Dec 1827-May 1834.**

These vital statistics were compiled from microfilms N3765 and N3766, AMICUS No. AN 7629447, at the National Library of Canada.. The Colonial Patriot was published by W. Milne, in Pictou, Nova Scotia. The editions on the microfilm run from 7 December 1827 to 20 May 1834 and were filmed by the Canadian Library Association. Some editions were missing and some had parts of pages cut out, often in the place where death and marriage notices were usually found. Page numbers were often difficult to determine and so have not been included. The entries are not reproduced verbatim, but have been edited for brevity. For example, the expression “in the....year of his/her age”, commonly used in the obituaries, is shortened here to “in his/her ....year”. Names beginning with “Mac” or “Mc” were frequently abbreviated as M’ in the paper. The abbreviation “N.B.” was used for “North Britain”, as Scotland was referred to at the time, as well as for New Brunswick.

Marriage entries are shown here with the groom’s surname listed first. Multiple marriages, reported in the same entry in the newspaper, have been listed separately in this record to facilitate searching.

Some names and dates were very difficult to read, even with magnification. Where doubt exists, possible alternate spellings or dates are shown in italics. The author would welcome any corrections or clarification which readers might be able to provide.
