## MODULES USING BASIC CALLS

## Get-In Modules to a Corner Box with Sides-Outside at Home

B1: Heads Star Right (or Left) until facing your corner
B1: Heads Pass Thru and U-Turn Back then Star Thru
B1: Heads Promenade Halfway, Heads Star Thru and Pass Thru
B1: Heads Right and Left Thru and Rollaway, Same Four Star Thru
B1: Heads Square Thru Four
B1: Heads Star Thru and California Twirl
B2: Head Ladies Flutterwheel \& Sweep a Quarter, Centers Pass Thru B2: Heads Touch 1/4, Those Boys Run

## Equivalents to Half of the Chicken Plucker

B1: Right and Left Thru, Centers Arch Dive Thru, Centers Pass Thru B1: Each 4 Circle Right Half, Veer Right, Veer Left, Centers Pass Thru
B2: Right and Left Thru, Pass Thru, Trade By
B2: Square Thru Three, Trade By
B2: Swing Thru, Boys Run, Ferris Wheel, Centers Square Thru Three

## Zeros for Normal Facing Couples

B1: Star Thru, Forward and Back, Right and Left Thru, Star Thru B1: Right \& Left Thru, Veer Left, Ladies Chain Down Line, Star Thru

B2: Right and Left Thru, Flutterwheel, Reverse Flutterwheel
B2: Star Thru, Pass Thru, Wheel Around, Star Thru
B2: Swing Thru, Boys Run, Wheel and Deal
B2: Swing Thru, Boys Run, Bend the Line, Reverse Flutter, Star Thru

## Geographical Zeros from Normal Eight Chain Thru

B1: Each Four Star Right, Original Centers Star Left
B1: Right and Left Thru, Dive Thru, Centers Square Thru Three
B2: Circle to a Line, Pass Thru, Wheel and Deal, Double Pass Thru, Leaders Partner Trade
B2: Swing Thru, Boys Run, Ferris Wheel, Centers Veer Left \& Veer Right

## TWO-COUPLE CHOREOGRAPHY

One of the skills required by a sight caller is the ability to call two-couple choreography. One way to practice two-couple choreography is by calling to only two couples. Begin with two facing couples usually standing where Head Couples would be. The goal is to be able to use two-couple calls, move those four dancers into various formations, and then rearrange them to place them back where they began.

## Example:

Two Ladies Chain, Flutterwheel and Sweep 1/4, Pass the Ocean, Swing Thru, Boys Run, Bend the Line, Star Thru, You're Home

Try doing this using the following list of calls:

## Box the Gnat

Trade - (Named)
Couples Trade Partner Trade Step to a Wave Swing Thru
Run
Pass the Ocean Wheel and Deal
Flutterwheel
Reverse Flutterwheel Sweep a Quarter
Touch 1/4
Box / Split Circulate

## ISOLATED SIGHT (Two Couple Sight)

An early step in the development of sight calling was the recognition that symmetry allows us to resolve by watching just four dancers. Isolated Sight does that in a very direct way. The idea of Isolated Sight is to use a Get-In to a known FASR, isolate four dancers, focus attention on them, use any series of calls that keep them together, bring them back to the same FASR (not necessarily the same geographic location) as that occupied at the end of the Get-In, and finally use a known Get-Out from that FASR.
In its simplest form the caller creates a Corner Box, uses a few calls that keep the four dancers from one box together in their half of the square, and eventually returns them to the same Corner Box for an Allemande Left. See the Example below. This is really just twocouple choreography being used for two groups of four dancers back-to-back or side-by-side in the square. Experienced callers often sight singing calls using the same technique.

Simple Isolated Sight Basic Example: The following sequence keeps the four dancers very close to the four original geographic locations using either a box or a wave.

Get-In: Heads (or Sides) Square Thru Four (Get-In to a Corner Box)
Two-Couple: $\quad$ Swing Thru, Boys Run, Bend the Line, (now Facing Lines)
(Sight this part) Right and Left Thru, Flutterwheel, Reverse Flutterwheel, (same Lines) Pass the Ocean, Ladies Trade, (Corner Box Wave)

Return to a Corner Box: Swing Thru, Boys Run, Wheel and Deal (Corner Box) Get-Out: Allemande Left.

Using the Basic two-couple call list, practice this simple form of Isolated Sight calling until it becomes easy. Vary the beginning by using other Get-Ins to a Corner Box (see page 2).

## USE A DIFFERENT CORNER BOX (OUTSIDES NOT AT HOME)

-- Heads Promenade Outside Halfway, Sides Star Thru and Pass Thru (This rotates the Heads-Outside Corner Box 180 degrees - called a Flip-Flop.)
-- Heads Star Thru, Double Pass Thru, Leaders Courtesy Turn, Right and Left Thru (This is a flip flop for Sides-Outside Corner Box.)
-- Heads Lead Right, Veer Left, Girls Circulate, Chain Down the Line, Each 4 Circle Left 1/4 (This rotates Heads-Outside Corner Box 90 degrees CCW.)
-- Head Two Ladies Chain, Sides Lead Right, Star Thru, Forward \& Back, Star Thru (This rotates Sides-Outside Corner Box 90 degrees CCW.)
-- Heads Promenade Outside Three-Quarters, Side Ladies Chain and Sides Pass Thru (This rotates Heads-Outside Corner Box 90 degrees Clockwise.)
