

Hexagon Ideas from September 2002 meeting:

Basic Singers (Easy Mainstream) (1-53):

- 1) Heads Star Thru and California Twirl, Swing Thru, Centres Run, Bend the Line, Right and Left Thru, Ladies Chain into a Promenade
- 2) Heads Flutterwheel and Sweep 1/4, Centres Pass Thru, Swing Thru, Girls Circulate, Swing Thru, Girls Run, Bend the Line, Go up and Back, Star Thru, Swing and Promenade short
- 3) Heads Pass the Ocean, Extend, Swing Thru, Men Run, Couples Circulate, Ladies Chain Down the Line into a full Promenade
- 4) Sides Lead Right and Circle to a Line of 6, Right and Left Thru, Star Thru, Pass Thru, [Trade By, Left Allemande], Swing and Promenade
- 5) Sides Pass Thru and Separate around 4 to line, Box the Gnat, Right and Left Thru, Circle Left, Allemande Left and Promenade

Basic Patter:

Heads Square Thru Four, Swing Thru, Girls Circulate, Men Trade, Men Run, Bend the Line Right and Left Thru, Lady Lead Flutterwheel, Men Reverse the Flutter into a Promenade

Head Ladies Chain Across, Sides Pass Thru and Separate around 2 to a Line, all Ladies Chain across, Slant Right go Right and Left Thru, Centre Pairs Straight across go Right and Left Thru, Circle Left, Allemande Left, Promenade

Sides Pass Thru and Separate Around Two to a Line, Go Up and Back, The other Ladies Chain Across, All the Ladies Chain Back, Slant Left Right & Left Thru, Straight Across Right & Left Thru, Flutterwheel, Reverse the Flutter, Pass Thru, Centre Couples Trade, Others Wheel and Deal Behind, Triple Pass Thru, First couples Lead to Right all follow into a short Reverse Promenade.

Mainstream Singers:

- 1) Heads Square Thru 4, Swing Thru, Centres Run, Wheel & Deal, Touch 1/4, Scoot Back, Swing, Promenade
- 2) Heads Pass the Ocean, Extend, Swing Thru, Spin the Top, Single Hinge, Long Column Circulate, Men Run, Pass Thru, Swing and Promenade
- 3) Sides Lead Right and Circle 6 to a Line, Pass Thru, 3 x 3 Tag the Line, Face In, Center Two Ladies Lead Flutterwheel, All Pass Thru, Centres Trade, Others Wheel and Deal behind, Triple Pass Thru, All turn to left and Promenade

Plus Singers:

- 1) Sides Lead Right and Circle 6 to a Line, Touch 1/4, Coordinate (normal feel), California Twirl and Promenade
- 2) Heads Square Thru Four, Dosado to a wave, Spin Chain the Gears (normal feel), Swing and Promenade (short)

Merengue Mixer created by cuers September 2002 Music: El Merengue, Roper Records XX-507

Intro: 4 feet apart, wait 2 measures (4 beats), strut together 4 to butterfly

A: Basic (slow side, close; slow side, close)
Glide (quick side, close, side close; slow side close)
Repeat Basic and Glide for a total of 4 times

B: Conga Walks in semi closed:

Down line – walk 2, turn to reverse and extend leg with heel to floor To reverse – walk 2, turn to line and extend leg with heel to floor In closed towards wall – walk, 2, 3, point towards centre and tip body out Towards centre – walk, 2, 3, point towards wall and tip body in

C: Arm Slides:

Man facing out and Lady facing in, each place hands on the others shoulders
In four beats slide apart to hands then in four more beats slide together.
Back Away Four, Together Four to a new Partner (diagonally to right)

Different Not Difficult Ideas

EASY MAINSTEAM:

Allemande Left, Pass Partner, Left Turn Thru with the next back to partner, Box the Gnat, Hold on for a Grand Right and Left

Allemande Left, Box the Gnat for a Wrong Way Grand, When you meet your partner, turn by the right and men into a Wrong Way Allemande Thar, Shoot the Star, Left Allemande

Heads Lead Right and Veer Left, Ferris Wheel and Centres Sweep 1/4, New Sides Lead Right, Swing Thru, Men Run, California Twirl and Promenade

Heads Lead Right and Circle to a Line, Box the Gnat and Pass Thru, Girls Run Right, Boys Run Right, Go Up and Back, Circle Left, Allemande Left and Promenade

Heads Right and Left Thru and Rollaway, Sides Pass the Ocean, Ladies Pass Thru, Centre Girls Run Left, Men Pass Thru, Centres Wheel and Deal, all Trade By, Swing Thru, All Eight Circulate, Grand Right and Left

LEFT HANDED MAINSTEAM:

Heads Left Square Thru Four, Make a Left Hand Star, Head Ladies Lead into a Right Hand Star, Left Allemande, Grand Right and Left

Heads Left Square Thru Four, Left Spin the Top, Girls Run Left, Wheel and Deal, Slide Thru, LA

Sides Left Touch 1/4, Walk and Dodge (girls walk, men dodge left), Veer Left, Couples Circulate, Half Tag, Walk and Dodge, Partner Trade, Left Touch 1/4, Each 4 Walk and Dodge, Trade By, Swing Thru and Turn Thru, Left Allemande

ALGUIRE MEMORIAL CALLERS SCHOOL 2003

Sunday Evening August 17th through Friday evening August 22nd, 2003

Teachers: Norm and Wendy Wilcox from Ontario

With the assistance of Kerry Fletcher and Dottie Welch from Nova Scotia

Curriculum: We are planning to cover the full Callerlab recommended School Curriculum with two levels of training appropriate for new and experience callers. Our Curriculum will include Choreographic Management, Teaching Techniques, Programming Concepts, Using Music Effectively, Analyzing Dance-ability and Leadership Issues. We will have some combined sessions and some separate sessions ensuring that all students have an opportunity to learn from Norm Wilcox.

Schedule: The School will begin with a Sunday evening get-together on August 17th. The following week will feature full days with 3-hour workshops each morning, afternoon, and evening. The school will end with a special dance featuring Norm Wilcox on Friday evening, August 22nd

Location: Debert Hospitality Centre, Debert, Nova Scotia (near Truro) This is a former military facility that has been converted to a Convention Centre.

Accommodations: The Debert Hospitality Centre has reasonable accommodations on location. The rooms are Spartan but adequate and cost \$46.00 per day including tax for a room with one double bed and shared bath. Each has closet, desk and all linens provided. Because this was a military base the bathroom facilities are unique with some sink and shower units and some sink and toilet units. However, there are ample and a few steps will take you to either type. The rooms are in sections of up to 10 bedrooms sharing a common area with television, minikitchenette and other amenities. Reservations for the Debert Hospitality Centre accommodations should be made with your school registration.

There are several nearby motels & camping for those wanting more luxury or less cost.
