

Ideas that Germinated during Callers School

From Réal:

Break Figure: <u>Heads work As Couples and Dosado</u>, Sides work As Couples and Dosado, All Circle Left, Allemande Left, Promenade

Patter: Heads <u>Dixie Style to a Wave</u>, Extend, Left Swing Thru, Girls Run, Promenade short

Patter / Singer: Heads Square Thru 2, Touch 1/4, Scoot Back, Boys Fold, <u>Single File Ladies Lead Dixie Style to a Wave</u>, Boys Cross Run, Half Circulate, Slide Thru at Home (or Boys Cross Run, all 8 Circulate, Swing and Promenade)

From Don:

Patter – Stuff the Chicken: Heads Square Thru Four, Right and Left Thru, Dive Thru, Centers Right and Left Thru and Veer Left, Chain Down the Line and Star Thru, Centers Pass Thru, Right and Left Thru, Pass Thru, Trade By, Left Allemande

Patter: Heads Square Thru 4, Right and Left Thru, Dosado to a Wave, (Centres Begin) <u>Left Swing Thru</u>, <u>Left Swing Thru</u>, Girls Cross Run, <u>Left Swing Thru</u>, <u>Left Swing Thru</u>, Girls Run, Wheel and Deal, Left Allemande, Face In at Home

Patter / Singer: Heads Lead Right, Swing Thru, <u>Scoot Back, Fan the Top, Recycle</u>, Star Thru, Pass Thru, Left Allemande (or Swing and Promenade)

Singer: Heads Pass Thru, <u>Separate around 1, Come Into the Middle and Pass Thru</u>, Right and Left Thru, Veer Left, Ferris Wheel, Centers Square Thru 3, Swing and Promenade

From Faye:

Patter / Singer: Heads Pass Thru, Separate around 1 to a Line, Forward and Back, Pass Thru, Wheel and Deal, <u>Girls Pass The Ocean</u>, Girls Single Hinge and Walk and Dodge, Touch 1/4, All 8 Circulate, Turn Thru, Allemande Left, (or after Touch 1/4, Boys Circulate, Swing and Promenade)

Patter / Singer: Sides Pass Thru, Separate around 1 to a Line, Forward and Back, Pass Thru, Wheel and Deal, Zoom, <u>Boys Pass The Ocean</u>, Boys Single Hinge and Walk and Dodge, Star Thru and California Twirl, Promenade Partner (or after Walk and Dodge, All Touch 1/4, Girls Circulate, Swing Corner and Promenade)

Singer: Heads Lead Right, Veer Left, Half Tag, <u>Cast Off 3/4, Fan the Top</u>, Single Hinge, Column Circulate, Boys Run, Pass Thru, Outsides Cloverleaf, Others Square Thru 2, Swing & Promenade

From Laurie:

Patter / Singer: Heads Touch 1/4, Those Boys Run, All Touch 1/4, <u>Walk and Dodge</u>, Partner Trade, Right and Left Thru, Pass the Ocean, Single Hinge, <u>Walk and Dodge</u>, Allemande Left (or Swing Corner and Promenade)

Patter / Singer: Heads Pass the Ocean, Extend, Swing Thru Double, Extend, Centers Hinge and Roll, Others Partner Trade and Roll, Grand Right and Left, Promenade (or Turn Thru, Swing Corner and Promenade)

Patter / Singer: Heads Square thru Four, Left Swing Thru, (with the Left) Relay the Deucey, Girls Cross Run, Half Circulate, Box the Gnat & Slide Thru at Home, (or Swing and Promenade)

From Ralph:

Patter / Singer: Heads Square Thru Four, Swing Thru, Boys Run, Half Tag, Scoot Back, Single Hinge, Girls Trade, Recycle, Allemande Left, Face In at Home, (or Swing and Promenade)

Patter / Singer: Heads Square Thru Four, [Dosado], Spin the Top, Spin the Top again, Boys Run, Couples Circulate, Bend the Line, Slide Thru, Left Allemande (or Swing corner), Promenade

Patter / Singer: Heads Lead Right and Veer Left, Chain Down the Line, Dixie Style to a Wave, Boys Trade, (Begin with the Left) Spin the Top, Girls Run, Bend the Line, Pass Thru, Allemande Left (or Swing and Promenade)

Patter / Singer: Heads Square Thru 2, Touch 1/4, <u>Half Scoot Back</u>, Centers Trade, Ends Circulate, Bend the Line, Pass Thru, Tag the Line In, Star Thru and Pass Thru, Left Allemande (or Swing and Promenade)

Patter / Singer: Heads Square Thru 4, Touch 1/4, <u>Scoot Back 1 1/2</u>, Centers Trade, Ends Circulate, Girls Circulate, Couples Circulate, Bend the Line, Square Thru 3, Left Allemande, (or Swing and Promenade)

Singer: Heads Square Thru Four, Swing Thru, Spin the Top, Slide Thru, Touch 1/4, Walk and Dodge, Partner Trade, Boys Walk and Girls Dodge, Swing and Promenade

THE GROUND RULES OF SQUARE AND ROUND DANCING

1) Be a Good Listener and Conscientious Learner

Concentrate and pay attention.

Be quiet both while dancing and when on the sidelines.

Don't anticipate the next call, wait for the caller to ensure success.

Make an effort to learn the correct call definitions.

2) Be Cooperative

Square dancing success depends on teamwork in the square.

Likewise, a strong square dance activity needs support and cooperation from all the dancers.

3) Be receptive to learning opportunities

Laugh at your mistakes and remember that this is a recreation not a competition.

Accept help, fill the hole and try to keep dancing.

Ask questions when you don't understand how to do a move or sequence.

4) Be On Time

The first tip is the warm-up for the evening.

Leaving early may leave 3 couples sitting.

5) Square Up Quickly

Finish your conversation and square up quickly when you hear the music begin.

Raise your hand to indicate where couples are needed.

Don't dance when you haven't learned the program being called.

6) Be Courteous

Ask your partner to dance.

Fill the first available square

Don't walk through a square.

Don't leave a square except in an emergency.

Thank your partner, the other dancers in your square and the caller or cuer.

7) Be Thoughtful

Be polite and gentle.

Be neat and clean – bath well and wear clean clothes.

Avoid eating onions, garlic or strong spices before a dance.

Don't cloud your wits with alcoholic beverages before or during a dance.

Don't attend when you are contagiously sick.

If you must be absent, let someone know, especially if the group is small.

8) Be Friendly

Wear your badge and a smile.

Get acquainted with other club members.

Welcome visitors and introduce yourself.

Avoid stacking squares or forming cliques.

Ask singles to dance including the leader's partner.

9) Take it easy

Pace yourself. Sit when you need to.

10) Enjoy yourself

Smile and expect to have a good time.

Clap enthusiastically for the music, the leader, the square and yourself.
