

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FASR Management using Mainstream

Here are suggested Mainstream calls for changing from the indicated starting formation to the formation named on the right along with some useful comments about how arrangements and relationships change.

1) From a Static Square:

- a) Heads Touch 1/4 & Walk and Dodge
- b) Heads Box the Gnat and Slide Thru
- c) Heads Lead Right, Veer Left, Half Tag
- d) Heads Pass Thru and Cloverleaf

(Lead Right Box) Eight Chain Thru Formation (Zero Box) Eight Chain Thru Formation BGBG Right-hand Parallel Waves Normal Double Pass Thru

Parallel Right-hand Waves with girls in centre

Half-sashayed Facing Lines

e) Heads Turn Thru & Separate around one to a Line Normal Corner Lines

2) From Facing Lines:

- a) (If normal) Slide Thru
- b) (If half-sashayed) Pass Thru, Ends Fold
- c) (If BBGG) Pass Thru, Half Tag
- d) (If normal) Pass Thru, Tag the Line In
- e) Centers (or Ends) Turn Thru
- f) Dixie Style to an Ócean Wave
- g) (If BBGG) Pass Thru, Ends Cross Fold, Star Thru Normal Facing Lines

3) From Eight Chain Thru Formation:

a) Eight Chain Three
b) Swing Thru, Spin the Top
c) Centers In
d) Pass to the Center
Trade By
Tidal Wave
Inverted Lines
Double Pass Thru

4) From Double Pass Thru Formation:

a) (If Normal) Double Pass Thru, Centres In,	Cast Off 3/4 BBGG Facing Lines
b) Double Pass Thru, Cloverleaf	Double Pass Thru (opposites now partners)

5) From Right-hand Parallel Waves:

a) Recycle	Eight Chain Thru Formation
b) (If BGGB) Single Hinge	BGBG Right-hand Parallel Waves
c) (If BGBG) Scoot Back	GBGB Right-hand Parallel Waves
d) (If BGBG) Walk and Dodge	Normal Lines Facing Out
e) Swing Thru, Spin the Top	Tidal Wave
f) (If Corner Waves) Spin Chain Thru	Opposite Right-hand Parallel Waves

6) From Right-hand Parallel Two-Faced Lines:

a) Half Tag	Right-Hand Parallel Waves
b) Couples Hinge	Tidal Two-Faced Line

7) From Columns:

a) Single Hinge (or Cast Off 3/4)

b) Each Four Walk and Dodge


Arrangement Puzzles

Find a way to create each of the following Formations and Arrangements and then figure out how to resolve from there. Attempt to minimize use of Extended Applications.

1) BBGG Columns

- 3) BGBG Two-Faced Lines
- 2) BGGB Facing Lines 4) Left-Hand BBGG Waves

Recognizing the Swing Thru, Turn Thru, Allemande Left Resolve



If you can recognize or make these FASRs, they have a useful snapshot resolution.

The first is a Lead Right Box FASR:

All dancers are beside their partner.

The outside man is facing his corner (the center man is not).

From a Static Square: Heads Lead Right, Swing Thru, Turn Thru, Allemande Left

The second is a Double Pass Thru FASR:

All dancers are beside their partner.

The outside man is looking at his corner (around the man in front of him).

From Zero Lines: Pass Thru, Wheel and Deal, Swing Thru, Turn Thru, Allemande Left

The third is a Quarter Tag FASR which results when the centers in the Double Pass Thru FASR of number 2 step to a wave:

The outside dancers are beside their partner.

The outside man is looking at his corner.

From a Static Square:

Heads Pass the Ocean, Very Centers Trade, Centers Swing Thru, Turn Thru, Allemande Left.
